Letter to Bishop Zubik

Asking for his encouragement to priests to preach about the ban of semi-automatic weapons as a pro-life issue.

From the APP letter:

You are ... a member of the USCCB whose chairmen of three committees issued a joint statement on July 6th of this year where they write "We support a total ban on assault weapons and limitations on civilian access to high-capacity weapons and ammunition magazines." Subsequently, on December 15th of this year, the Association of US Catholic Priests (AUSCP), after quoting in full the three bishops' statement wrote: "We are grateful to . . . Archbishops Coakley, Lori and Cordileone for voicing their compassion for the victims and their families, as well as their support for a ban on all assault weapons."
